Definitions

- CJCC:** Refers to the Community Junior Cricket Council, which is the governing body responsible for junior community cricket made up of Associations in the Perth and Peel metropolitan area.
- Association(s):** Refers to the Association or Council that administers the Competition that is being played.
- Playing Conditions:** Refers to playing conditions within the CJCC Administrative Guide for all CJCC endorsed competitions
- Match Details:** Contained within CJCC Stage 1, 2 or 3 Match Details, Ground Set Up and Match Day Summary

Policy

All suspected or identified breaches are to be reported to the Association's WA Cricket Competition Administrator or Conducts Officer or President/Secretary who shall act as outlined below.

Penalties For Breaches Of The Playing Conditions (contained in the CJCC Administrative Guide)

Stage 1 Matches

Competitions will be checked a minimum of twice per season for breaches of the Playing Conditions and Match Details.

This is an education period so compliance requirements are understood before entering Stage 2. When a breach of the Playing Conditions or Match Details is identified a letter shall be sent to the offending team's club President offering support and outlining any required actions by the club.

Team penalties **shall not** apply.

Breaches of the **Eligibility to Play** rules noted below may result in Code of Behaviour charge(s) against coaches and/or team mangers.

2. Eligibility to Play

2.1 Registration and Team Lists

(a)

2.2 Player Age Requirements

(b) and (c)

2.3 Overage and Underage Players

(b) and (d): that haven't been granted a dispensation.

Penalties For Breaches Of The Playing Conditions (contained in the CJCC Administrative Guide)

Stages 2 and 3 Matches

Competitions will be checked weekly for breaches of the Playing Conditions and Match Details.

In the first instance where a breach of the Playing Conditions or Match Details is identified a letter shall be sent to the offending team's club President offering support and required actions by the club.

Any additional breaches by that team shall require a further letter to the offending team's club President offering further support, outlining any required actions and outlining the potential sanctions should any further breaches occur.

Additional breaches may result in Code of Behaviour charge(s) against coaches and/or team managers.

No team penalties apply for U12 competition(s); however, additional breaches may result in Code of Behaviour charge(s).

First Time Breaches of the Playing Conditions Resulting in a Forfeit.

In Stages 2 and 3 some breaches will receive no letter of support and required action. These breaches are:

2. Eligibility to Play

2.1 Registration and Team Lists

(a): penalty for breach – forfeit

2.2 Player Age Requirements

(b) and (c): penalty for breach – forfeit

2.3 Overage and Underage Players

(b) and (d): that haven't been granted a dispensation, penalty for breach – forfeit

5. Finals

5.2 Eligibility for Finals

(a) and (d) dot point 1: penalty for breach - forfeit.

(b), (c) and (d) dot point 2 that haven't been granted a dispensation, penalty for breach - forfeit.

7. Two Teams in the Same Competition

(a) that haven't been granted approval by their association, penalty for breach - forfeit.

Additional Breaches Following Two Letters of Support and Required Action

These breaches will see the following sanctions imposed:

Breach of Playing Conditions – contained within the CJCC Administration Guide

2. Eligibility to Play

2.1 Registration and Team Lists

(b), (c) and (d) Penalty for breach – 1 match point per breach

2.4 Dress Standards

(b): penalty for breach - 1 match point per breach (for clarity, if more than one player in a team breaches this rule, each player breaching shall result in one match point being deducted, up to a maximum of 4 points per team per match)

3. Match Officials

3.2 Umpires

(a), (b), (c) and (d): Code of conduct charge to the umpire plus the coach if the umpire is a team appointed one.

3.4 Coaching During Play

(f) and (g): Code of conduct charge to the coach(es).

4. Match Results and Players Scores

4.1 My Cricket

(b), (c) and (d): penalty for breach - two points penalty per match

Breach of Match Details - Contained Within CJCC Stage 2 and Stage 3 Match Details, Ground Set Up and Match Day Summary

3. Team Numbers

(c) and (d): penalty for breach – one points penalty per breach per match.

6.3.1 Batting Rotations

(a), (c), (d) and (e); penalty for breach – two points penalty per breach per match.

6.3.2 Mandatory Retirements

(a) and (b); penalty for breach – one points penalty per breach per match.

6.3.3 Mandatory Retired Batters

(a), (b), (c) and (d); penalty for breach – two points per penalty per breach per match

6.4.1 Bowling Rotations

(a), (c), (d) and (e); penalty for breach – two points penalty per breach per match.

6.4.2 Maximum Overs per Bowler

Stage 2 (a), (b) and (c); penalty for breach – two points penalty per breach per match.

Stage 3, 20 Over Matches (a), (b) and (c); penalty for breach – two points penalty per breach per match.

Stage 3, 30 Over, 35 Over and 40 Over Boys Matches, 30 Over Girls Matches (a), (b), (c) and (d); penalty for breach – two points penalty per breach per match.

6.5 Fielding

Stage 2 (a); penalty for breach – two points penalty per match.

Stage 3 (d) (i); penalty for breach – two points penalty per match.

NOTES

- Teams cannot be penalised more match points for breaches than they earned for that match, however, additional breaches may result in team coaches, managers or clubs charged with code of conduct offences.
- If there is a legitimate or unavoidable reason for breaching the Playing Conditions in either the Administrative Guide or Match Details, coaches are encouraged to firstly note the reason(s) in the scorebook and bring it to the attention of the opposition coach. The coach may also wish to note the reason(s) on the MyCricket match report.

Examples of legitimate or unavoidable reasons may include: players being absent, player injury resulting in them not being able to take full active part in the match, players being unavailable to go and bat at the time they are required to bat.
